In Copenhagen there stands a rundown shipyard that was derelict before painter, Anette Holmberg discovered it. 'The old Burmeister and Wain shipyard had been vacant for years but when I came to visit this rustic building I could instantly see the potential, explains Anette. 'It can be lonely being an artist so I wanted to build a creative community around me in an inspiring space.

She has created a professional creative community in the enormous 1400m² warehouse. 'The aim was to create a place where a mixture of

commercial, artistic and innovative forces can meet and interact with each other.' Anette has filled the space with seventeen studios shared among fifty-two tenants who are mixture of architects, artists, designers, set builders and journalists. 'In a world where we feel increasingly divorced from the people around us, there's a yearning for community,' she says.

Each of her tenants are shown the space they can occupy but it is up to them to build their own walls and interiors. Anette's studio is vast allowing her to hang her large canvases and paint freely. She has built herself a cosy nook, including a kitchen and seating area to sit and enjoy a coffee or relax with her laptop on a worn leather chair.



Empowering each other, creating shared moral values and tackling local problems including crime and youth disfranchisement, says Anette.

Anette now receives visits from her government and other global governments to learn how to turn barren industrial areas into thriving community hubs.

With thriving cities short of housing, it is an exciting prospect to think that individuals are seeing the value of underused buildings and neighbourhoods. Combining business and creative hubs creates a very positive future.
